# **23<sup>rd</sup> SEA GAMES Sailing Competition**

### **Technical Organization / Organizing Authority**

The Philippine Sailing Association (PSA) is The Organizing Authority and is responsible for the full control of the Technical Organization of the Sailing Competition, in consultation with the ISAF Technical Delegate, when necessary.

### **Rules**

The 23rd SEA Games Sailing Competition will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rule of Sailing.

The following rules, regulations and instructions will apply:

- The SEA Games Federation Statutes and Rules
- The Philippine SEA Games Technical Handbook
- The Philippine SEA Games Sailing Competition Measurement Regulations
- The Philippine SEA Games Sailing Competition Coach Boat Regulations
- The Rules of the respective classes
- The Notice of Race
- The Sailing Instructions

No national authority prescriptions will apply.

If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

### **Advertising**

Advertising will be restricted to Category A

### **Eligibility**

Each country may enter one boat in each class. The Organizing Authority will not provide boats for any class.

A maximum of 18 competitors and 4 substitutes may be entered, in compliance with paragraph above.

A registered substitute may replace a competitor only on medical ground and with prior written permission of the International Jury.

In addition to the competitors, each country may register a maximum of 10 team officials.

The 23rd SEA Games Sailing Competition will be contested in the following events:

## Schedule of Events

Ten races are scheduled for each class

14 November	Venue available for practice
26 November	Measurement, Competitor's Briefing and Team Manager's Meeting
27 November	Measurement, Practice Races and Welcome Ceremony
28 Nov – 3 Dec	Racing for all classes
3 December	Awarding and Closing Ceremonies

## Measurement

An ISAF approved Measurer will be appointed.

All boats (including spars, sails and equipment) may be measured in accordance with her class rules and any special rules contained in the Notice of Race, Sailing Instructions and the Measuring Regulations.

The dates and times for measurement will be published before the regatta. Boats and equipment shall be presented at the designated time.

## Sailing Instructions, Measurement and Coach Boat Regulations

The Sailing Instructions will be available on 14 November 2005

The Measurement and Coach Boat Regulations will be available on 1 September 2005.

## Venue and Courses

The 23rd SEA Games Sailing Competition will be held at Subic Bay, Zambales, Philippines. This will also be the competition Training Venue.

Courses will be trapezoid and windward / leeward courses.

Race office and Secretariat will be based in Subic Bay Yacht Club Boathouse.

## **Penalty System**

For the Hobie 16 Class rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

## **Support Boats**

Team Leaders, coaches and other support personnel are required to comply with the Philippine SEA Games Sailing Competition Coach Boat Regulations. Charter boats will not be available.

## **Berthing**

Boats, including support boats, shall be kept in their assigned places in the boat park in Subic Bay Yacht Club.

## **Radio Communications**

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

## **Prizes and Trophies**

The following prizes will be awarded for each class:

First Prize:	Gold Medal and Diploma
Second Prize:	Silver Medal and Diploma
Third Prize:	Bronze Medal and Diploma
Fourth to Sixth Prizes:	Diploma

## **Technical Delegate**

The 23rd SEA Games Organizing Committee will invite a Technical Delegate appointed by ISAF.

## **International Jury**

An International Jury will be appointed in compliance with RRS Appendix N, and shall comprise of one International Judge or suitably qualified equivalent from each participating country. The independent Chairman will be appointed by the Organizing Authority. The decisions of the Jury will be final as provided in Rule 70.4

## **Scoring**

6 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

When fewer than 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores

When from 7 to 9 races have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score

When 10 races have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

If there are less than 4 entries in a class a bronze medal shall not be awarded

## **Practice**

The sailing venue will be open for practice from 0900 on 14 November 2005.

## **Awarding Ceremonies**

The Awarding Ceremonies shall be held after the completion of all competition.

## **Meteorological Conditions**

The average air temperature is from 27° to 30° Celsius. The median water temperature is 28° Celsius and the prevailing wind is generally from the North East and between 8 and 15 knots.

**Disclaimer of Liability**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4 Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.
